Theme

"The En-gendering of (Anti-)Thought in Higher Education, Global Politics, and Posthuman Becoming," an international critical humanities double forum, is organized by the Asia Theories Network and hosted by the Department of Foreign Languages and Literatures at National Taiwan University, Taiwan. In recent decades, global higher education has been confronted with tremendous challenges in relation not just to its survival and transformation but also to its calling as the institution that "generates" and practices reflexive thinking, which is gradually considerably "supplemented" by (post-)global political changes and technological "smart" auto-generativity. Reflexivity and automaticity, with the latter in both the technological and political senses, seem to be split wide apart and are in critical tensions with each other. Are there possibilities for a reflexive automaticity as well as automatic reflexivity, a question that concerns us and our future. It seems that a new phase of onto-politico-technical evolution is to come, or is coming, driving the world into automatic or anxious mutations. This double forum invites scholars from various countries to engage with related issues that bear on the relationships between higher education, thinking, politics, violence, and "epochal" technologies, as these subjects are determinant or reflective/diffractive about our current world and its future.
