Charles Cheng is a third secretary posted in India. He's tasked with the Indo-Pacific, the Quad and overall strategy-related issues. He was the first officer at the ministry to cover the Indo-Pacific strategy when it was launched by the Trump administration. During his three and a half years at the HQ, in addition to the Indo-Pacific, he also covered the Marshall Islands, the New Southbound Policy and New Zealand.

Jackie Li is a 33 years old former student from the Department of Foreign Languages and Literature in National Taiwan University from 2006-2010.
